The Wireless Headset with LED Display is a sleek wireless headset that enables comfortable handsfree communication with your Bluetooth® enabled wireless technology cell phone.

Talk time: Up to 14 hours

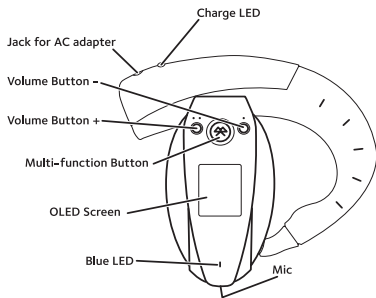
Standby time: Up to 200 hours

## Introduction

### Bluetooth Technology

The range of operation between Bluetooth wireless technology-enabled devices is about 10M (approx. 33 ft.). These devices do not require line of sight and can transmit through walls and other non-metal obstacles. Thick or reinforced concrete can limit the range.

## Getting to know your headset



Your package contains the following items:

- (A) Wireless headset
- (B) Earhook
- (C) Fit Ring
- (D) Travel Charger
- (E) User Guide

## Charging the Headset

Before using the headset, you must charge it for a minimum of two hours. When fully charged, the battery provides up to five hours of talk time, and up to 120 hours of standby time.

1. Plug the AC adapter connector into the AC jack on the earhook.

**Note:** The Amber LED on the earhook will light while the headset is charging. When charging is complete, the Amber LED will turn off.

2. Unplug the AC adapter connector from the AC jack.

## Battery Status Indicator

The amber LED on the earhook will remain lit while the battery is charging. When charging is complete, the LED will turn off and the battery icon on the screen will indicate that the battery is fully charged.


## Switching the Earhook

The earhook can be switched to the opposite side of the unit in order to use it on either ear.


- Gently pull the earhook from the main unit and plug it in to the identical hole on the opposite side.

## Powering the headset on and off

### Turn the headset on

Press and hold  for three or four seconds. “On...” displays briefly on the screen, and a tone will sound. The headset then goes into “Standby” mode. If you have paired the headset with a mobile phone, it is ready to make and receive calls.

### Turn the headset off

When the headset is on, press and hold  for approximately two seconds. “Off...” displays briefly on the LED and “off” tone will sound.



## Pairing the headset to your mobile phone

Pairing is the process of linking the headset with your mobile phone. After pairing is complete, the headset can only be used with the mobile phone with which it was paired. If you wish to use the headset with a different mobile phone, you must repeat the pairing process with the new mobile phone. When you do this, the headset will no longer work with the previous mobile phone.


**Note:** Before pairing the headset, ensure that the battery is fully charged.

## Pair the device

Ensure that the headset and mobile phone are turned off.

1. Press and hold the **Multi-function button** () for five seconds. “Pairing...” displays on the screen, and you will hear a tone.
2. Release . The headset is now in Pairing Mode.
3. Turn on the mobile phone and place it within 10M (33 ft.) of the headset.
4. Initiate the device discovery feature on the mobile phone. Refer to the phone’s user guide for instructions for initiating this feature.
5. When prompted by the mobile phone, enter **0000** as the pin code (or “pass code,” or “pass key”). When pairing is completed, “Ready” displays briefly on the screen.





## To cancel pairing mode

While you are in pairing mode, you can cancel the pairing process, and turn off the headset. Press and hold  for three seconds. “Off...” displays on the screen, and you will hear a tone.

## Show caller ID



Caller ID is automatically enabled on your headset. You can disable the Caller ID display function to ensure that others cannot see your caller ID information.

## To disable the caller ID display

1. In standby mode, press and hold  then  in any order. A previously dialed or received number displays on the screen.
2. While a number displays on the screen, press both  and  simultaneously. "ID blocked" displays on the screen.

When you receive any incoming phone calls "ID blocked" displays rather than the phone number.

## To enable the caller ID display



When the caller ID display function is disabled, press both  and  simultaneously. "ID enabled" displays on the screen. When you receive any incoming phone calls the number displays on the screen.

## View phone book

You can view and browse your mobile phone's phone book directly from the headset.

**Note:** This feature must be supported by your mobile phone.



To view and browse your mobile phone's phone book:

1. Ensure the headset is in standby mode.
2. Briefly press either  or  to display the number on the screen.

**Note:** View mobile phone's phone book will enable the show caller ID function.

## View the last five calls on the headset

To access the last five calls on the headset:

1. Ensure your headset is in standby mode.
2. Briefly press  or .
3. Repeatedly press the button to cycle through the last five calls.

## Making calls

You can make calls from your mobile phone, or directly from your headset using voice dialing, last number redial, and dial phone book commands.




### Make calls from your mobile phone

Dial the call from the your mobile phone.

Depending on the mobile phone you are using, the call may be automatically connected to your headset, or you may need to manually transfer it. Refer to your mobile phone user guide for more information.


### Make calls using phone book

**Note:** This feature must be supported by your mobile phone.

1. Press either  or  to access the phone numbers from your phone book.
2. Press  on your headset. The call is automatically connected to your mobile phone.



### Make calls using voice dialing

**Note:** This feature must be supported by your mobile phone.

1. Press  on your headset.
2. Speak the name of the person you wish to call. The call is automatically connected to your mobile phone.

## Make calls using last number redial


**Note:** This feature must be supported by your mobile phone.

1. Press and hold either  or .
2. Your mobile phone automatically dials the last number dialed.


## Receiving calls

You must configure your mobile phone to receive calls directly on your headset.


**Note:** Refer to the mobile phone user guide for instructions on this feature.

When your mobile phone rings, press  on your headset. The call is automatically connected to your headset.

## Reject calls

When your mobile phone rings, press and hold  for three seconds.

## Ending calls

When you have finished your call, press . The call will be disconnected.


## Transfer calls

You can transfer calls connected to your headset back to your mobile phone, or from your mobile phone to your headset


- While in a call, press  to transfer the call to or from the phone and headset.

## Adjust the volume

### To increase the volume


While in a call, briefly press  to increase volume by one step. Repeat this process until you reach the desired volume level.

### To decrease volume


While in a call, briefly press  to decrease volume by one step. Repeat this process until you reach the desired volume level.

## Muting the headset


You can mute and un-mute the microphone temporarily so that you cannot be heard.

- While in talking mode, press and hold  for three seconds, then release. A tone will remind you you are muted

### Un-mute the headset

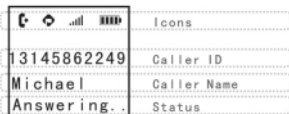
When the microphone is muted, press and hold  for three seconds

## Three way calling

To enable three way calling, press and hold . "Switching..." displays on the screen.

## Icons

### Headset function icons



Indicates that there is no audio connection in the headset.



Indicates that the headset is in a call.

### headset connection icons



Indicates that the headset is waiting to connect to a mobile phone.



Indicates that the headset is connected to a mobile phone.

### Volume icon



Indicates the current volume level.

### Battery icon



Indicates the current battery charge level.
